Brief study of the last days of great tribulation


This presentation is a graphical study of Last days of the great tribulation mentioned in the books of Revelation and in the prophetic book of Daniel. In this presentation you will learn about the last three and a half years tribulation period.

The Beast of Revelation

Revelation 13:1-5¶ And I stood upon the sand of the sea, and saw a beast rise up out of the sea, having seven heads and ten horns, and upon his horns ten crowns, and upon his heads the name of blasphemy. 2 And the beast which I saw was like unto a leopard, and his feet were as *the feet* of a bear, and his mouth as the mouth of a lion: and the dragon gave him his power, and his seat, and great authority. 3 And I saw one of his heads as it were wounded to death; and his deadly wound was healed: and all the world wondered after the beast. 4 And they worshipped the dragon which gave power unto the beast: and they worshipped the beast, saying, Who *is* like unto the beast? who is able to make war with him? 5 And there was given unto him a mouth speaking great things and blasphemies; and power was given unto him to continue forty and two months.

We begin with Revelation 13 which is a description of the beast and his reign of time allotted by God to rule upon the earth. The scriptures state "power was given unto him to continue forty and two months." Just what does this mean? In the next slide we will look at this time period of the beast' reign.




"Forty and two months," means 42 months of time, or 1260 days, or if we count the days, we have three and a half years of time the beast will reign.

The Two Witness of God

Revelation 11: 1-8 ¶ And there was given me a reed like unto a rod: and the angel stood, saying, Rise, and measure the temple of God, and the altar, and them that worship therein. 2 But the court which is without the temple leave out, and measure it not; for it is given unto the Gentiles: and the holy city shall they tread under foot forty and two months. 3 ¶ And I will give power unto my two witnesses, and they shall prophesy a thousand two hundred and threescore days, clothed in sackcloth. 4 These are the two olive trees, and the two candlesticks standing before the God of the earth. 5 And if any man will hurt them, fire proceedeth out of their mouth, and devoureth their enemies: and if any man will hurt them, he must in this manner be killed. 6 These have power to shut heaven, that it rain not in the days of their prophecy: and have power over waters to turn them to blood, and to smite the earth with all plagues, as often as they will. 7 And when they shall have finished their testimony, the beast that ascendeth out of the bottomless pit shall make war against them, and shall overcome them, and kill them. 8 And their dead bodies shall lie in the street of the great city, which spiritually is called Sodom and Egypt, where also our Lord was crucified.

And I will give power unto my two witnesses, and they shall prophesy a thousand two hundred and threescore days, clothed in sackcloth.

Next notice that Revelation 11 refers to the same time period that the Gentiles will tread the holy city, or Jerusalem, for 42 months, and also it states that God will send two witnesses in these last days who shall prophesy 1260 days.



The two witnesses shall prophesy 1260 days or three and a half years during the reign of the beast.

The Two Witness of God

Revelation 11: 7 And when they shall have finished their testimony, the beast that ascendeth out of the bottomless pit shall make war against them, and shall overcome them, and kill them. 8 And their dead bodies shall lie in the street of the great city, which spiritually is called Sodom and Egypt, where also our Lord was crucified.


Revelation 11 also states that at the end of their testimony, the beast shall put the two witness to death in the earthly city of Jerusalem.

The Prophesy of Daniel


Daniel 12:1-11 ¶ And at that time shall Michael stand up, the great prince which standeth for the children of thy people: and there shall be a time of trouble, such as never was since there was a nation even to that same time: and at that time thy people shall be delivered, every one that shall be found written in the book. 2 And many of them that sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. 3 And they that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament; and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever. 4 But thou, O Daniel, shut up the words, and seal the book, even to the time of the end: many shall run to and fro, and knowledge shall be increased. 5 \(\text{T hen I Daniel looked, and,} \) behold, there stood other two, the one on this side of the bank of the river, and the other on that side of the bank of the river. 6 And one said to the man clothed in linen, which was upon the waters of the river, How long shall it be to the end of these wonders? 7 And I heard the man clothed in linen, which was upon the waters of the river, when he held up his right hand and his left hand unto heaven, and sware by him that liveth for ever that [it shall be] for a time, times, and an half; and when he shall have accomplished to scatter the power of the holy people, all these things shall be finished. 8 And I heard, but I understood not: then said I, O my Lord, what shall be the end of these things? 9 And he said, Go thy way, Daniel: for the words are closed up and sealed till the time of the end. 10 Many shall be purified, and made white, and tried; but the wicked shall do wickedly; and none of the wicked shall understand; but the wise shall understand. 11 And from the time that the daily sacrifice shall be taken away, and the abomination that maketh desolate set up, there shall be a thousand two hundred and ninety days.


We next turn to the book of Daniel. In Daniel 12 we have the time period of which begins with the beginning of Jewish ritual sacrifices and the end of those sacrifices, to the time period of the moment where the abomination which makes desolate, something Jesus spoke and warned about, would take place. This event takes place in the last 1290 days. Next well see what this means.



1290 days or forty-three months, or three and half years plus one month. A quick math shows us this means 30 days of time in which the beast sets up the abomination in the temple of God. Next, we will look at what this brief time period means.



The scripture in Daniel 8:13-14 says 2300 days. This time period of the beginning daily sacrifices to the time of the abomination set up will be according the scripture 2300 days. Some quick math shows us this means 1290 days subtracted from 2300 days equals 1010 days, or otherwise, two years, nine months, and ten days, beginning prior to the three and a half-year tribulation period. At the start of the 1010 days on likely the Day of Atonement (9 months and ten days) the daily sacrifices of the Jews in Jerusalem will begin. At the end of the 1010 days the daily sacrifice will be ended and then the Beast will reign forty and two months or 1260 days and then we add the 30 more days in which the Abomination of desolation will be set up in the temple.



When the beast sets up the abomination of desolation, believed to be in the last temple raised up by the Jews, in this brief time period the beast will execute the two witnesses of God.


The Last days of the beast

Daniel12:11-13 And from the time that the daily sacrifice shall be taken away, and the abomination that maketh desolate set up, there shall be a thousand two hundred and ninety days. 12 **Blessed is he that** waiteth, and cometh to the thousand three hundred and five and thirty days. 13 But go thou thy way till the end be: for thou shalt rest, and stand in thy lot at the end of the days.


Daniel 12 gives another time period mentioned that of 1335 days, Daniel is told that "blessed is he who waited and comes to the 1335 days," then the prophesy of Daniel ends . What does this 1335 days mean?

The Last days of the beast Blessed is he that waiteth, and cometh to the thousand three hundred and five and thirty days. 1335 days = 43 months and 15 days 1335 -1290 = 45 days 45 - 30= 15 days Blessed is he who waits 1335 days Prior to Tribulation period Forty and two months

1335 days is equal to 43 months and fifteen days, put another way if we do the math and subtract 1290 from 1335, we arrive at 45 days. If we subtract 30 days from 45 days, we have 15 days of time. What does this mean?




In the 15 remaining days we have to turn to Matthew 23 when Jesus talks about the great tribulation, we see that he says something amazing that those days will be shortened. Indeed, the day of the last day of great tribulation are forty-five last days. Now let's look closely at this last 45 days.




Jesus stated explicitly "After the tribulation of those days," that then shall appear in heavens the sign of Jesus coming and God shall then gather in the rapture his saints of remnant Israel and the Church and the dead in Christ shall rise up to the heavens with Jesus!

Luke 21:28 And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh.

Jesus said, of these last days of tribulation "And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh."



We have in this study revealed the last days of tribulation, of which after the rapture of God's children, then shall God send the last plagues and his wrath on the earth of all those who rebelled against God and against his Christ.



I hope you have been most blessed by this brief graphical study of the last days of the three-and a half-year tribulation, as we await the final return of our Lord and Savior and the rapture of God's children. As Jesus our Lord stated, "And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh."
